The CSA Mid-year meeting was held in beautiful historic Fredericksburg, Va., on October 24-25.

The meeting was a joint endeavor with the Virginia Postal History Society, CSA Col. Wayne Farley presiding.

There were two interesting presentation.

First, Gen. Jim Monroe presented the "3 cent 1861 Confederate Postmaster Provisional from Fort Valley, Georgia." Six CSA three-cent Postmaster Provisionals are listed in *Scott Specialized Catalogue*, while the Fort Valley Provisional (number seven) is listed in the CSA Catalog as A-FTV-GA-E01.

The second presentation was by Col. Keith E. Littlefield, who discussed "Fredericksburg's Virginia's Confederate Postal History."

It was an enlightening expose on the many postal canceling devices used in Confederate Fredericksburg during the period when the city changed hands 10 times.

In addition, Littlefield presented evidence that the Fredericksburg CSA Postmaster Provisional sheets were printed locally with the star ornaments on the stamps matching those on local commercial 10 and 25 cent scripts.

Littlefield is finalizing his research and is asking for member help in documenting the earliest and latest usages of the five Confederate townmarks (see the related story on pages 22-23).

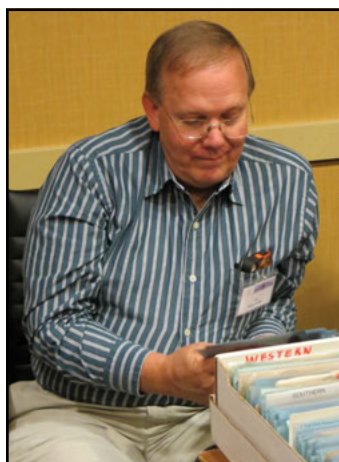
